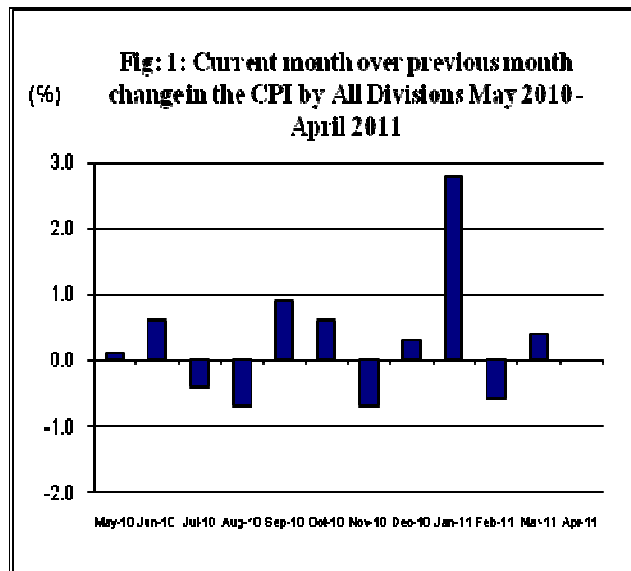

### CONSUMER PRICE INDEX - April 2011

(Base Period: Average Prices August 2010 = 100)

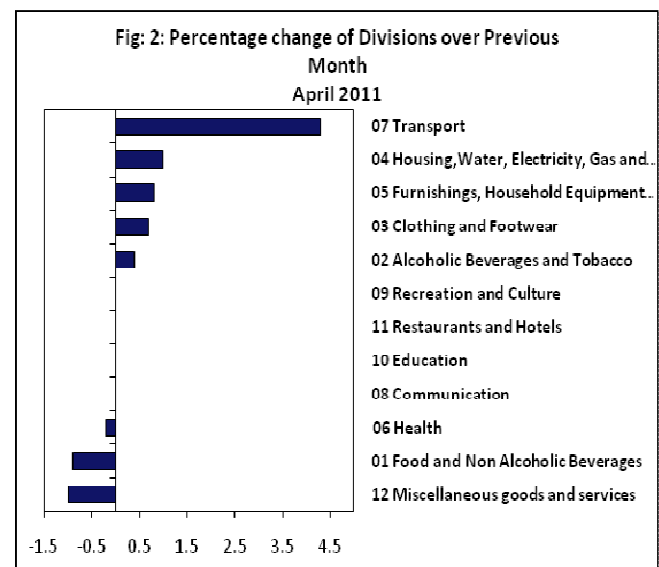
#### SUMMARY

The All Items Consumer Price Index for the month of April 2011 registered no change when compared to the previous month, and an increase of 3.3 percent when compared to the same month of last year. Depicted in Fig 1 are the month to month changes in the Consumer Price Index by all Divisions from May 2010 to April 2011.



Miscellaneous Goods and Services index recorded a decrease of 1.0 percent. Decreases were also recorded for the Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages index of 0.9 percent and a slight decrease of 0.2 percent in the Health index. No changes were recorded for the

Communication index, Recreation and Culture, Education and Restaurants indices. Increases were recorded for Transport index of 4.3 percent, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels of 1.0 percent, Furnishing, Household Equipment and Maintenance index of 0.8 percent as well as increases of 0.7 percent in the Clothing and Footwear index and 0.4 percent in the Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco index. Graphically presented in Fig 2 is the April 2011 percentage change of Divisions over March 2011.



The Imported Goods Component of the Consumer Price Index registered an increase of

0.9 percent from March 2011. This increase was mainly due to higher prices recorded for Fuel (petrol and diesel), kerosene, rice, and chicken leg quarters.

The Local Goods Component of the Consumer Price Index registered a decrease of 0.6 percent when compared to the previous month. This decrease was mainly due to lower prices recorded for fresh fish (piece and string), tomatoes, taamu, chinese cabbage and pumpkins.

Lower prices recorded for fish (piece and string), tomatoes, round cabbage, pumpkin, turkey wings and mutton flaps are reflected in the 0.9 percent decrease in the Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Index.



A decrease of 1.0 percent in the Miscellaneous Goods and Services was mainly due to lower prices recorded for diapers huggies and Gel LeFlur (1125 mls).



The 4.3 percent increase in the Transport index was mainly due to higher prices recorded for

Fuel (petrol and diesel) and airfares (Apia-Auckland-Apia).



Higher prices recorded for kerosene and Electricity (kwh) were the main contributors to an increase of 1.0 percent in the Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels index.



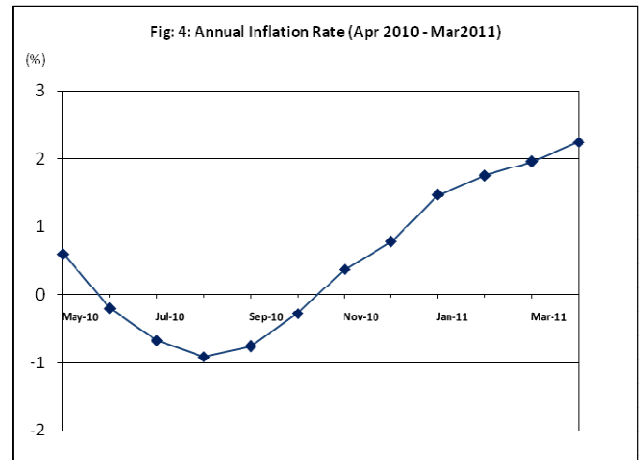
The 0.4 percent increase in the Alcohol Beverages and Tobacco index was mainly due to higher prices recorded for the Vailima beer (355mls).



The All Items Underlying Index for April 2011 registered an increase of 0.2 percent when compared to March 2011, and an increase of 3.8 percent when compared to April 2010. The 0.2

percent increase in the Overall Underlying Index is attributed to increases of 0.1 percent in the imported component and 0.5 percent increase in the local component.

The twelve months ending April 2011 compared to the twelve months ending April 2010 shows an increase of 2.2 percent.

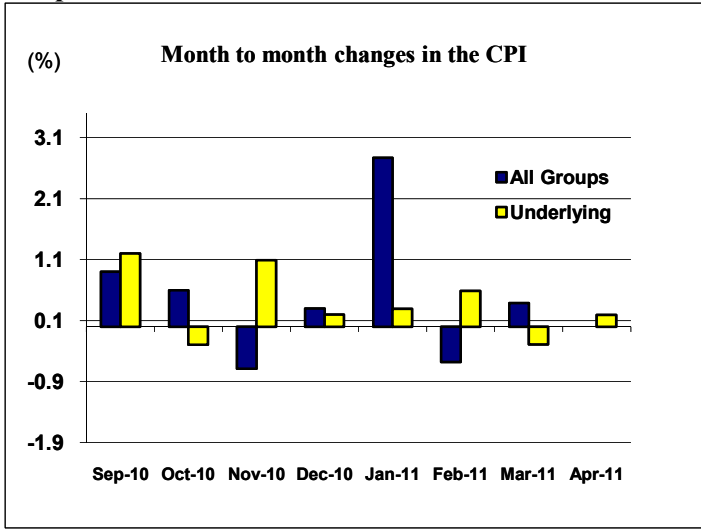
