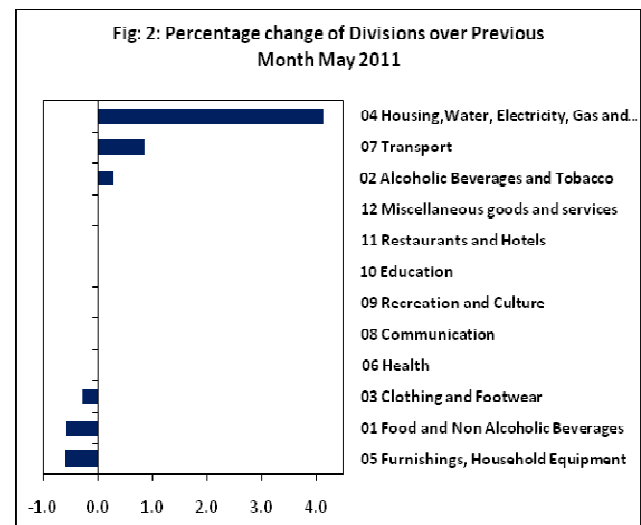
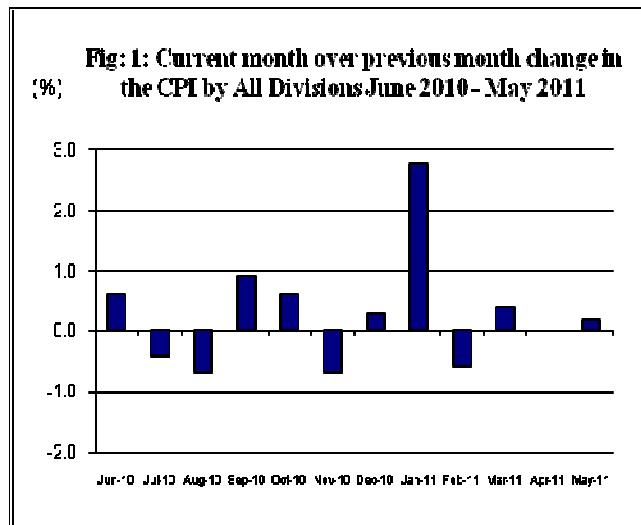
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX - May 2011

(Base Period: Average Prices August 2010 = 100)

SUMMARY

The All Items Consumer Price Index for the month of May 2011 registered an increase of 0.2 percent when compared to the previous month, and an increase of 3.4 percent when compared to the same month of last year. Depicted in Fig 1 are the month to month changes in the Consumer Price Index by all Divisions from June 2010 to May 2011.

Recreation and Culture, Education, Miscellaneous Goods and Services, Health and Restaurants indices. The Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages together with Furnishings Household Equipment and Maintenance both registered decreases of 0.6 percent. Graphically presented in Fig 2 is the May 2011 percentage change of Divisions over April 2011.



The 0.2 percent increase in the Overall Index was mainly due to an increase of 4.1 percent in the Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels. Increases were also recorded for Transport with 0.8 percent and Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco with 0.3 percent. No changes were recorded for Communication,

The Imported Goods Component of the Consumer Price Index registered an increase of 0.4 percent from April 2011. This increase was mainly due to higher prices recorded for Fuel (petrol and diesel), cigarette paper (50 sheets), roofing iron (Zincalume 12ft) and kerosene.

The Local Goods Component of the Consumer Price Index registered no change when compared to the previous month.

Higher prices recorded for electricity (kwh), kerosene and roofing iron (zincalume 12ft) were the main contributors to an increase of 4.1 percent in the Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels index.



An increase of 0.8 percent in the Transport Index was mainly due to higher prices recorded for Fuel (petrol and diesel).



Higher price recorded for cigarette paper (50 sheets) is reflected in the 0.3 percent increase in the Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco index.



Lower prices recorded for taro, yam, fish (piece), round cabbage, cucumbers, and taamu are reflected in the 0.6 percent decrease in the Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages Index.

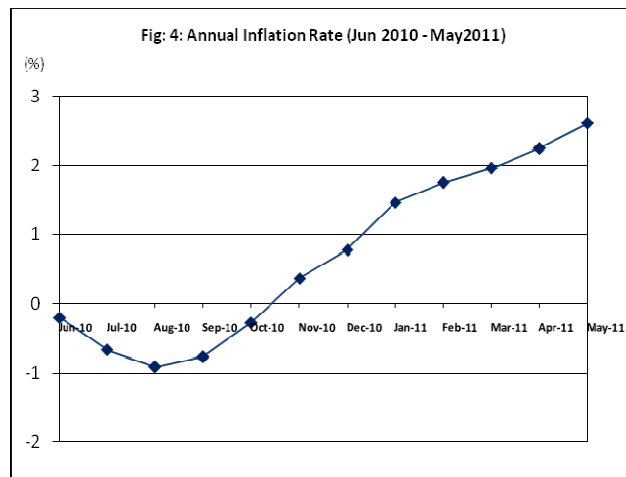


The 0.6 percent decrease in the Furnishing Household Equipment and Maintenance was mainly due to lower prices recorded for washing powder (boom 200grms) and mosquito coil.



The All Items Underlying Index for May 2011 registered no change when compared to April 2011, but an increase of 3.9 percent when compared to May 2010. The Imported Items Underlying Index recorded no change, while the Local Items Underlying Index registered an increase of 0.1 percent.

The twelve months ending May 2011 compared to the twelve months ending May 2010 shows an increase of 2.6 percent.
