International Arrival Statistics FOURTH QUARTER 2010

Summary:

This release summarizes Samoa's International Arrival Statistics for the fourth quarter (October – December) of 2010.

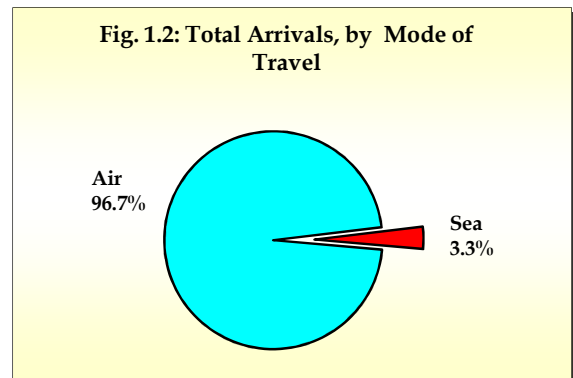
The source documents used for the compilation of statistics on international migration are the Immigration Arrival and Departure forms completed by all incoming and outgoing travelers at ports of arrival and departure. The four ports of entry for international travel to Samoa are: (i) Apia Wharf (ii) Satittoa Wharf ⁽¹⁾ (iii) Faleolo and (iv) Fagalii ⁽²⁾ International Airports.

Additionally, Air being the most preferred mode of travel to Samoa, accounting for 96.7 percent (45,437) of total arrivals, while those that traveled by sea accounted for the remaining 3.3 percent (1,561). (Refer Fig. 1.2).

1. ARRIVALS

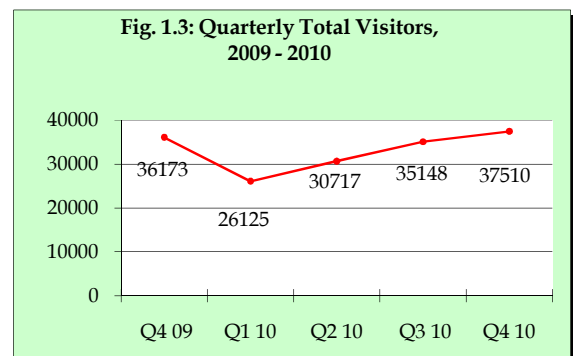
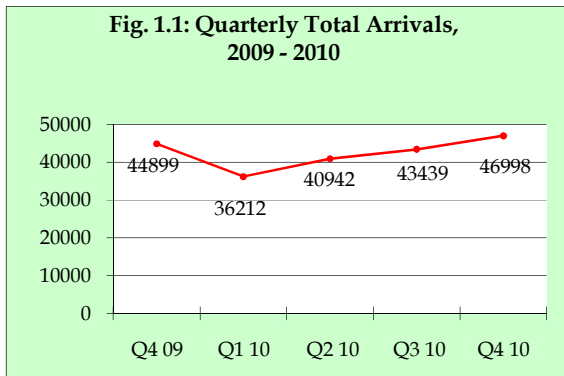
1.1 TOTAL ARRIVALS

The total International Arrival Statistics recorded during the reference period (table 1) reveals an increase of 8.2 percent when compared to the previous quarter (August - September 2010) and an increase of 4.7 percent over the corresponding quarter of October – December 2009. (Refer Fig. 1.1).



1.2 TOTAL VISITORS

Of total arrivals, Overall Visitors numbering 37,510 for the quarter under review illustrates an increase of 6.7 percent over the previous quarter and an increase of 3.7 percent over the corresponding quarter of October – December 2009. (Refer Fig. 1.3).



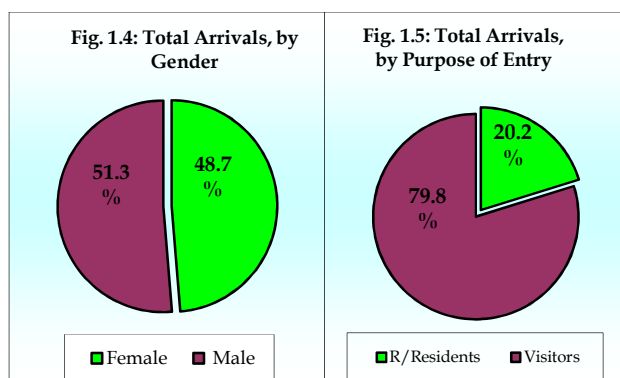

Considering 97.9 percent of total visitors arrived by air carrier, those that traveled by sea carrier round up the remaining 2.1 percent. Visitors' share of 79.8 percent of total arrivals is marginally lower than the 80.9 percent reported in the previous quarter and the 80.6 percent reported in the same quarter of 2009.

1.3 TOTAL ARRIVALS BY GENDER

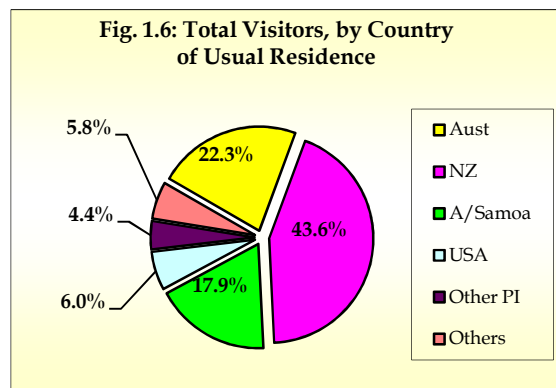
During the quarter under review, total arrivals by age and gender (Table 2) discloses that males recorded just over half of the traveling public at 51.3 percent (slightly lower than the 52.4 percent reported in the previous quarter) while their female counterparts constitute the remaining 48.7 percent (slightly higher than the 47.6 percent reported in the previous quarter). (Refer Fig. 1.4).

Of all arrival travelers, overall visitors (including transients) registered 40.2 percent (18,880) for males while females had 39.7 percent (18,630). Returning residents recorded 11.2 percent (5,244) for males while females had 9.0 percent (4,244). (Refer Fig. 1.5). The majority age for inbound travelers to Samoa from October – December 2010 ranges from 15 years to 59 years.

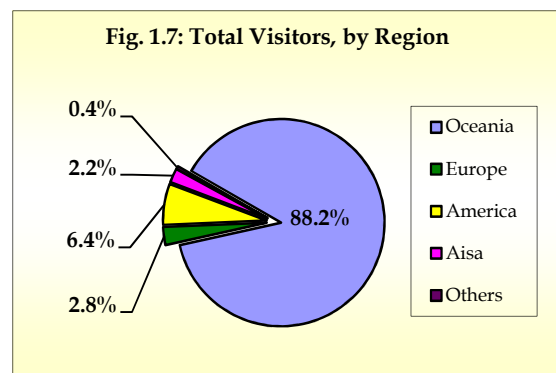


1.4 VISITORS ARRIVALS BY COUNTRY OF USUAL RESIDENCE

New Zealand still remains as the leading country in visitors' arrival by country of usual residence (Table 3) accounting for 43.6 of total visitors with 16,371. Australia followed in with a 22.3 percent share (8,371) which is then trailed by American Samoa with 17.9 percent (6,712) while the United States of America anchored the principal source markets with a distant share of 6.0 percent (2,260). 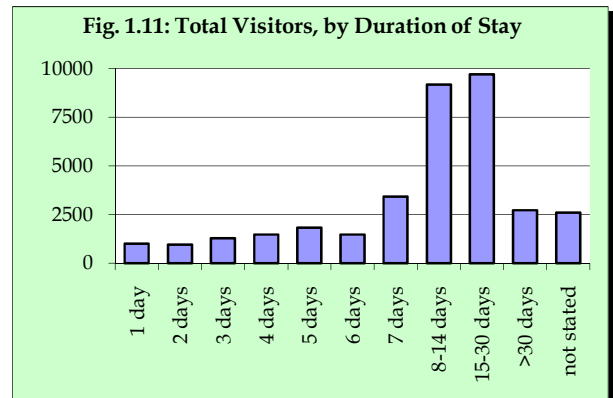
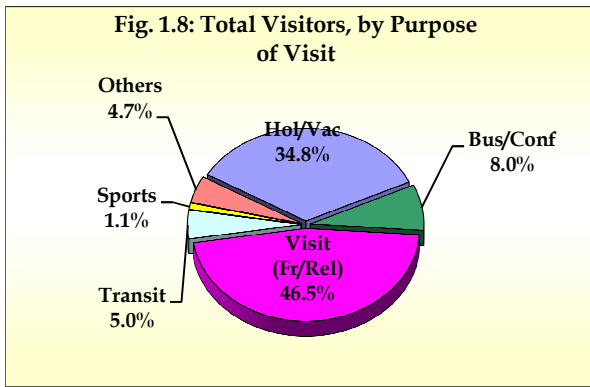
By region, the Oceanic Region portrays the highest share of total visitors with 88.2 percent followed by America and Europe with 6.4 percent and 2.8 percent respectively. The Asian region exhibits the lowest share with only 2.2 percent (Refer Fig. 1.7).



1.5 VISITORS BY PURPOSE OF VISIT

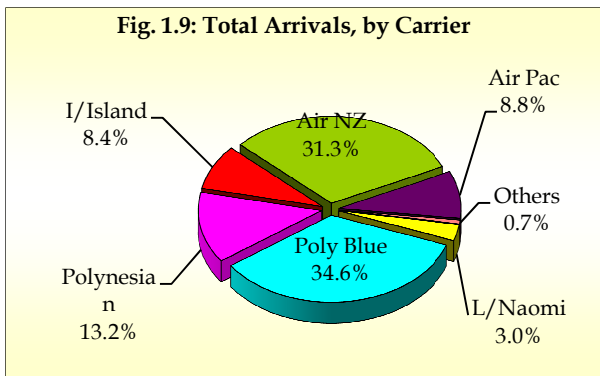
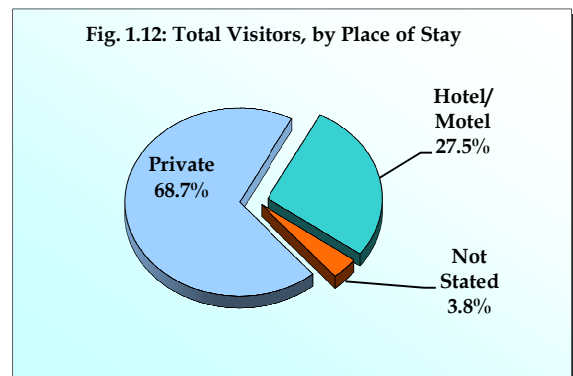
As depicted in Table 4, New Zealand, American Samoa, Australia, and the United States of America constitute 89.8 percent of all visitors visiting Samoa while other countries round up the remaining 10.2 percent during the reference period.

Furthermore, 46.5 percent (17,424) of all visitors entered our shores to Visit Friends/ Relatives while those that were here on Holiday/ Vacation accounted for 34.8 percent (13,036) of all visitors. Those that were here for Business and Conference registered 8.0 percent (3,014) while those who entered our shores for sports recorded 1.1 percent (407). Transients bound for other destination and those who were here for other purposes registered 5.0 percent (1,876) and 4.7 percent (1,753) respectively. (Refer Fig. 1.8).



1.6 CARRIER

As tabulated in Table 5, Poly Blue leads the way for arrival by carriers' during the reference period with a 34.6 percent share (16,283 passengers) followed by Air New Zealand with a share of 31.3 percent (14,728 passengers) while Polynesian Airlines brought in 13.2 percent (6,190) of total arrivals. Air Pacific recorded an 8.8 percent share (4,123) followed by Inter Island with 8.4 percent (3,942). Lady Naomi registered a 3.0 percent share (1,387) while other carriers round up the remaining 0.7 percent (345). (Refer Fig 1.9).



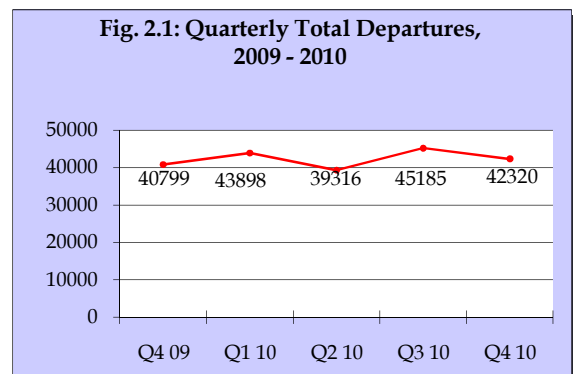
2. DEPARTURES

2.1 TOTAL DEPARTURES

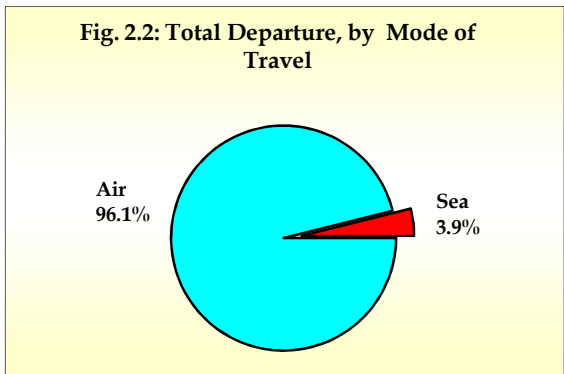
The total International Departure Statistics recorded during the reference period (table 1) reveals a decrease of 6.3 percent compared to the previous quarter (July – September 2010) and an increase of 3.7 percent over the corresponding quarter of October – December 2009. (Refer Fig. 2.1).

1.7 VISITORS DURATION/ PLACE OF STAY

The usual trend of visitor's duration of stay in Samoa (Table 6) is a week up to a month. (Refer Fig. 1.11). In addition to this, 68.7 percent (24,492) of visitors reported staying with private accommodations or families/ relatives while 27.5 percent (9,793) stayed in hotels/ motels. (Refer Fig. 1.12).

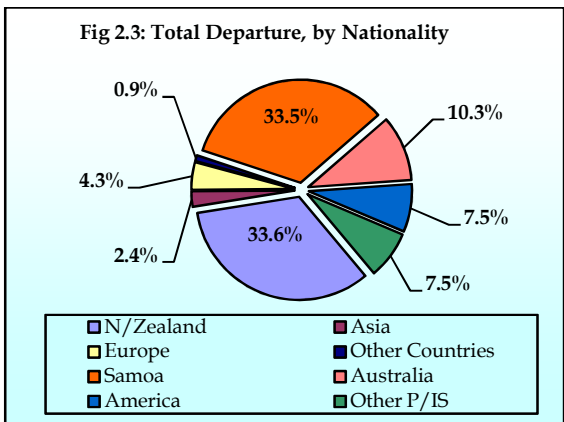


Furthermore, Air being the most preferred mode of travel away from Samoa, accounting for 96.1 percent (40,676) of total departures, while those that traveled by sea accounted for the remaining 3.9 percent (1,644). (Refer Fig. 2.2).



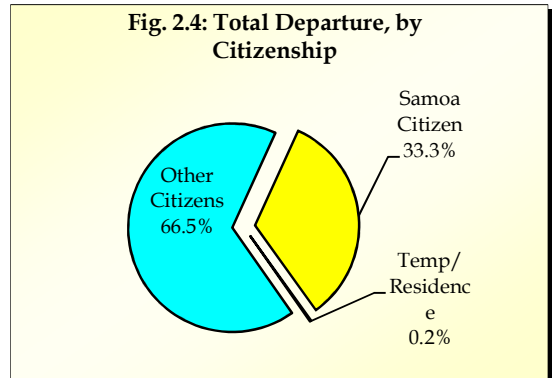
2.2 TOTAL DEPARTURE BY NATIONALITY

The majority of emigrants (Table 7) specifically from Samoa, New Zealand, Australia, and the United States of America accounted for 84.9 percent (35,937) of total departures during the reference period. Fig. 2.3 below provides a more detailed graphical analysis of total departure by nationality.



2.3 TOTAL DEPARTURE BY CITIZENSHIP

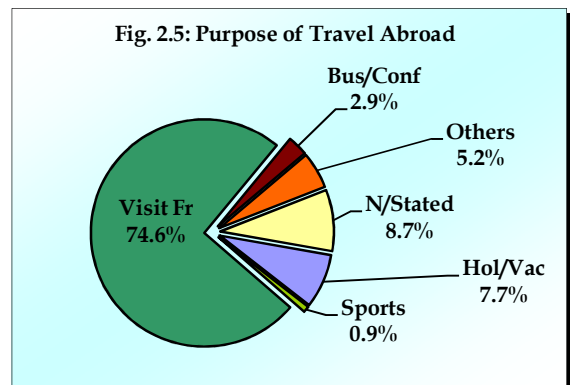
As tabulated in Table 7, Other Citizens constitute 66.5 percent (28,150) of total departures during the reference period while Samoa Citizen constitutes 33.3 percent (14,073). Temporary Residence makes up the remaining 0.2 percent (97) of total departures. (Refer Fig. 2.4).



2.4 PURPOSE OF TRAVEL ABROAD

During the reference period, a total of 14,073 (Table 8) Samoa citizens left our shores for overseas countries. Of this total, 54.6 percent (7,686) were males and the remaining 45.4 percent (6,387) were females.

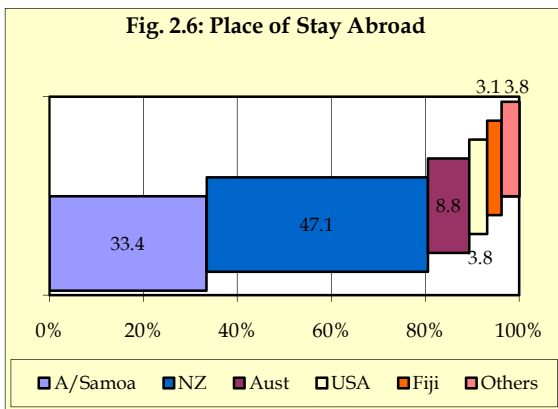
By purpose of travel abroad, almost three quarters (10,497) of Samoan migrants traveled overseas to visit friends/ relatives while 7.7 percent (1,088) left for holiday/ vacation. Furthermore, those that traveled for business/ conference and sporting activities constituted 2.9 percent (405) and 0.9 percent (133) respectively. Those that left our shores for other purposes reported 5.2 percent (725) while the remaining 8.7 (1,225) is represented by those Samoan citizens who did not wish to reveal their purpose of travel abroad. This is graphically depicted in Fig. 2.5.



2.5 PLACE OF STAY ABROAD

The majority of Samoans leaving our shores traveled to New Zealand as indicated by 47.1 percent (6,635) in Table 9, which is then followed by American Samoa with 33.4 percent (4,700). Australia comes in as the third main place of stay abroad yielding 8.8 percent (1,232), followed by The United States and Fiji with 3.8 percent (540) and 3.1 percent (437) respectively.

Fig. 2.6 portrays a graphical impression of the main place of stay abroad by Samoa Citizens.



2.6 DEPARTURE BY OCCUPATION

As depicted in Table 10, the majority of Samoans leaving our shores were students, yielding 16.2 percent (2,275) followed by professionals with 11.1 percent (1,558) then by service workers reporting 9.7 percent (1,370). A more comprehensive graphical analysis of departures by occupation for Samoa citizens is exhibited in Fig. 2.7.

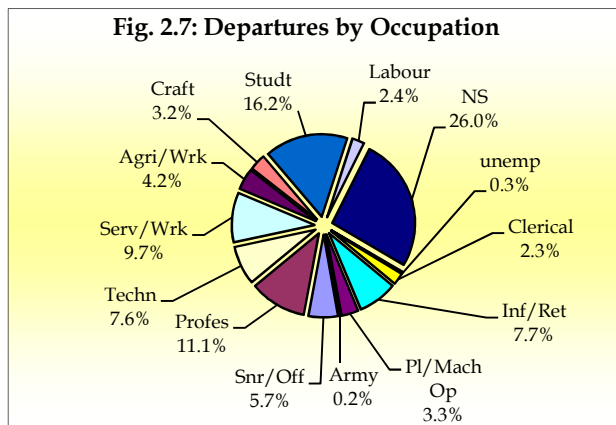
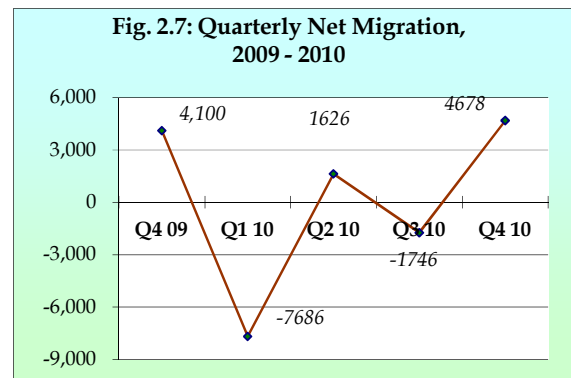


Table 10 further revealed that the majority of Samoa Citizens departing our shores have either completed or are currently attending Secondary Education level, yielding 36.6 percent.

3. NET MIGRATION

During the reference period, net migration stood at 4,678 (Table 1) implying that there were more incoming travelers (arrivals) than out-going travelers (departures). This shows an increase of 14.1 percent when compared to the same period of 2009 where net migration stood at 4,100.

As presented in Fig. 2.7, the most significant change in net migration occurred during the first quarter of 2010 with -7686 travelers. On the contrary, the less significant change occurred during the second quarter of 2010 with a net migration of 1,626 travelers.
