### MERCHANDISE TRADE

June 2018 quarter

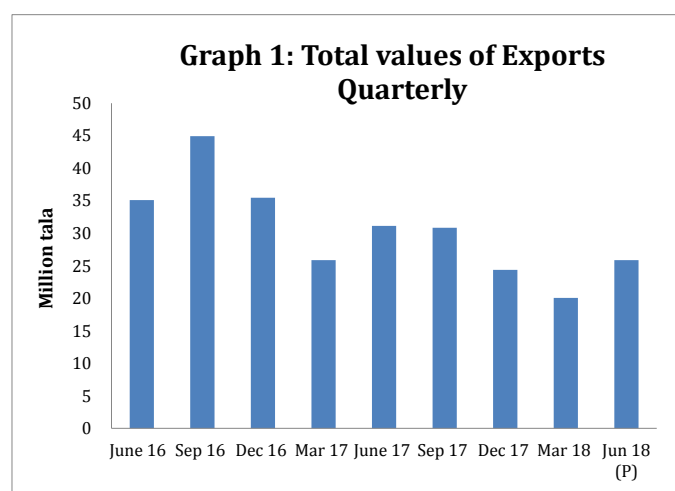
#### Highlights of the quarter

- Exports value rose 29.0 percent from the March 2018 quarter.
- Imports value rose 15.5 percent from the March 2018 quarter.
- There was a trade deficit of \$201.8 million.

#### Overview

#### Value of Exports

In the June 2018 quarter, exports were valued at \$25.9 million, increasing 29.0 percent from the previous quarter. Mainly responsible for the current increase were higher values of petroleum oils and plastic products exports. In comparison with the corresponding quarter of 2017, the current value of exports decreased 17.0 percent. (See Table 1 and Graph 1).

The four quarters ending June 2018 showed a 26.4 percent decrease in the total value of exports when compared with the four quarters ending June 2017.

#### Principal export commodities<sup>1</sup>

In the June 2018 quarter, **Petroleum oils<sup>2</sup>** exports became the top commodities exported, increasing 32.3 percent (to \$7.6 million) from the previous quarter. In comparison with the same quarter of 2017, the current value of petroleum oils exports decreased 8.7 percent.

**Fish** exports decreased 6.6 percent (to \$5.5 million) from the previous quarter, accounting for 21.5 percent of total exports value. When compared with the corresponding quarter of 2017, the current value of fish exports decreased 48.0 percent.

**Fruit juices** exports were valued at \$2.0 million; accounting for 7.6 percent of total exports value. This value was 85.5 percent higher than the previous quarter and 31.6 percent higher than the corresponding quarter of 2017.

**Taro** exports had a total value of \$1.8 million, accounting for 6.8 percent of total exports value, increasing 29.7 percent from the previous quarter but decreasing 49.9 percent from the corresponding quarter of 2017.

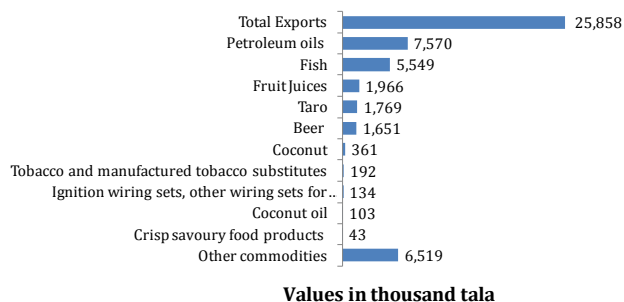
**Beer** exports were valued at \$1.7 million, accounting for 6.4 percent of total exports value, increasing 6.7 percent from the previous quarter and 52.8 percent from the corresponding quarter of 2017.

Exports of **tobacco** and **coconut oil** were increase from the previous quarter, valued at \$192 thousand and \$103 thousand respectively while exports of **coconut**, **Ignition wiring sets** and **crisp savoury food products** were decreased from the previous quarter, valued at \$361 thousand, \$134 thousand and \$43 thousand respectively. Exports of all other commodities were valued \$6.5 million. (See Table 2 and Graph 2).

### Country of Destination for Exports

In the June 2018 quarter, **American Samoa** remained the largest export markets despite the 8.4 percent decrease in its value from the previous quarter, accounting for 18.6 percent of total exports values. In comparison with the corresponding quarter of 2017, the current value of exports to American Samoa decreased 46.8 percent.

Exports to **New Zealand** increased 11.3 percent from the previous quarter, accounting for 18.4 percent (\$4.8 million) of total exports value. When compared with the same quarter of 2017, the current value of exports to New Zealand decreased 24.5 percent.

Exports to **USA** were increased to \$4.0 million from \$1.1 million in the previous quarter, accounting for 15.6 percent of total exports value. In comparison with the corresponding quarter of 2017, the current value of exports to USA was two times higher. The current increase was mainly driven by higher values of fruit juices exports

Exports to **Australia** had a total value of \$3.4 million, accounting for 13.1 percent of total exports value. This value was 2 times higher than the previous quarter but 40.6 percent lower than the corresponding quarter of 2017, with petroleum oils (up \$1.1 million) the main driver for the current increase of exports to Australia

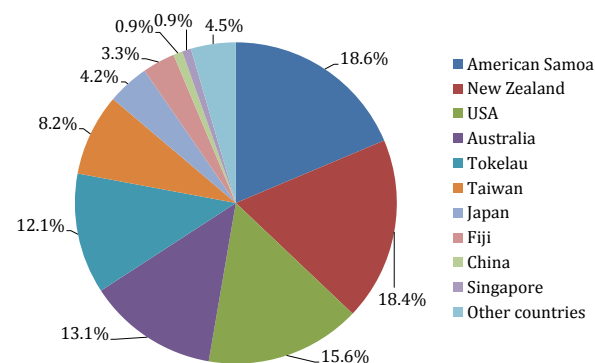
Exports to **Tokelau** were valued at \$3.1 million, accounting for 12.1 percent of total exports value, increasing 11.4 percent from the previous

quarter and 20.7 percent higher from the same quarter of 2017.

Exports to **Taiwan, Fiji and China** were also increased from the previous quarter, accounting for 8.2 percent, 3.3 percent and 0.9 percent of total export values respectively while exports to **Japan and Singapore** were decreased, accounting for 4.2 percent and 0.9 percent of total export values respectively.

Other countries of destination for exports accounted for 4.5 percent of total exports value. (See Table 4 and Graph 3)

June 2018 quarter**

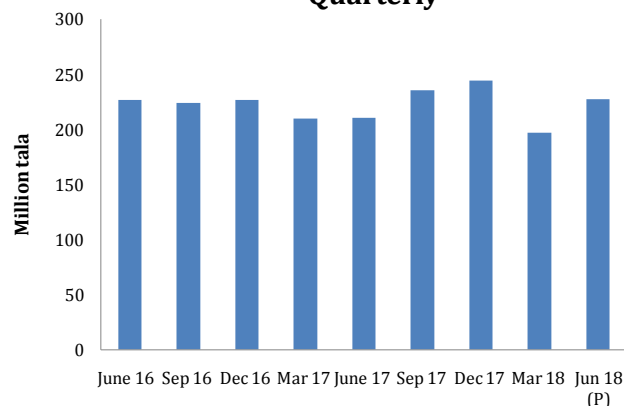

### Value of Imports

In the June 2018 quarter, imports were valued at \$227.7 million. This value was 15.5 percent and 8.1 percent higher than the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of 2017 respectively. (See Table 1 and Graph 4).

The four quarters ending June 2018 showed a 3.8 percent increase in the total value of imports

when compared with the four quarters ending June 2017.

### Principal Imports Commodities

In the June 2018 quarter, **mineral products** maintained the largest share of all imports commodity groups, accounting for 20.9 percent (\$47.6 million) of total imports value, increasing 51.5 percent and 31.6 percent from the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of 2017 respectively.

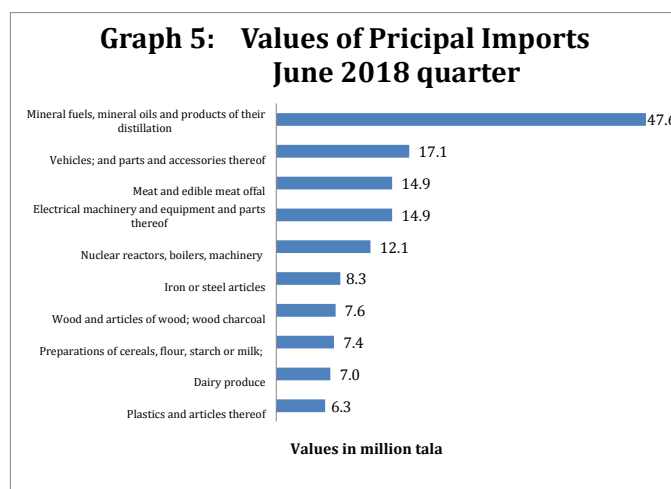
**Vehicles and parts and accessories thereof** increased 23.8 percent (to \$17.1 million) from the previous quarter, accounting for 7.5 percent of total imports value. In comparison with the June 2017 quarter, the current value of vehicles and parts thereof increased 72.8 percent.

Imports of **electrical machinery and equipment and parts thereof** and **meat and edible meat offal** were both valued at \$14.9 million (6.6 percent each of total imports value). Imports of electrical machinery and equipment and parts thereof decreased 5.0 percent from the previous quarter but increased 82.7 percent when compared with the corresponding quarter of 2017. Imports of meat and edible meat offal increased 5.5 percent and 2.2 percent from the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of 2017 respectively.

Imports of **nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery** were valued at \$12.1 million (5.3 percent of total imports value), increasing 15.0 percent from the previous quarter and 0.02 percent from the corresponding quarter of 2017.

**Iron or steel articles** imports were valued at \$8.3 million (3.6 percent of total imports value), increasing 63.2 percent from the previous quarter but 39.5 percent lower than the June 2017 quarter.

Imports of **wood and articles of wood, preparations of cereal, flour, starch or milk, dairy produce** and **plastics and articles thereof** were increased from the previous quarter, valued at \$7.6 million, \$7.4 million, \$7.0 million and \$6.3 million respectively while other commodities had a combined total of \$84.3 million. 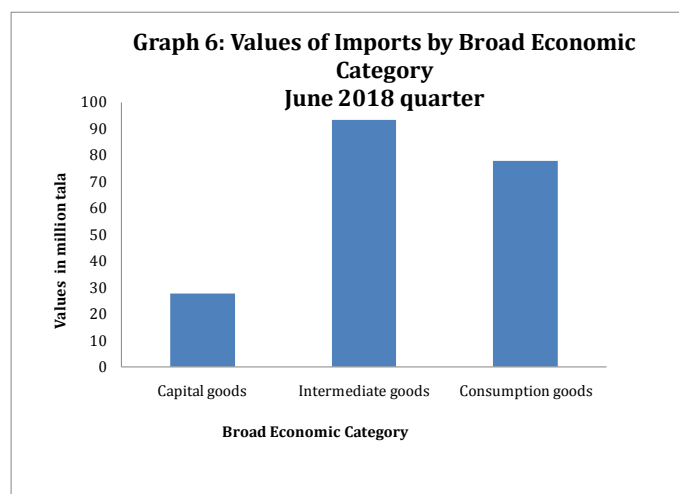

### Imports by Broad Economic Categories

For the three main broad economic categories in the June 2018 quarter, **capital goods** were valued at \$27.7 million (12.1 percent of total imports value), increasing 5.0 percent from the previous quarter.

**Intermediate goods** were valued at \$93.2 million (40.9 percent of total imports value), increasing 21.8 percent from the previous quarter.

**Consumption goods** were valued at \$77.8 million (34.2 percent of total value), increasing 5.0 percent from the previous quarter. (See Table 5 and Graph 6).

### Major Source Markets of Imports

**New Zealand** continued to be the leading source markets of imports in the June 2018 quarter, accounting for 28.9 percent of total imports value, increasing 22.6 percent from the previous

quarter and 16.6 percent from the same quarter of 2017.

Imports from **Singapore** accounted for 20.2 percent of total imports value, increasing 41.5 percent from the previous quarter and 25.0 percent from the corresponding quarter of 2017.

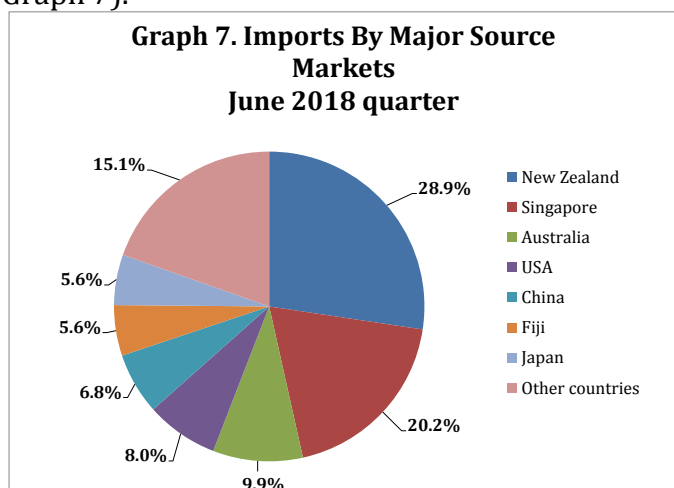
Imports from **Australia** accounted for 9.9 percent of total imports value, decreasing 0.9 percent and 11.1 percent from the previous quarter and the same quarter of 2017 respectively.

Imports from **USA** accounted for 8.0 percent of total imports value, decreasing 15.5 percent from the previous quarter and 20.9 from the corresponding quarter of 2017.

Imports from **China** accounted for 6.8 percent of total imports value, decreasing 8.8 percent from the previous quarter but 10.7 percent higher than the same quarter of 2017.

Imports from **Fiji and Japan** accounted for 5.6 percent each of total imports value. Imports from Fiji recorded a 1.9 percent 17.3 percent increase from the previous quarter and the corresponding quarter of 2017 respectively while imports from Japan was two times higher than the previous quarter and the same quarter of 2017.

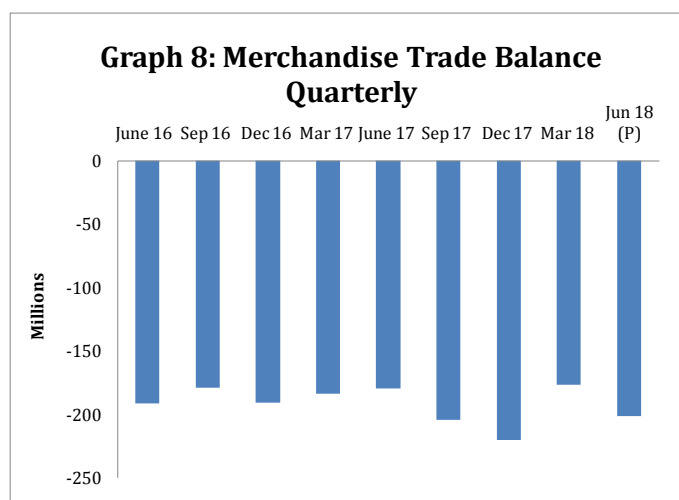
All other countries of imports accounted for less than 5.0 percent each shares of total imports had a combined total of 15.1 percent. (See Table 6 and Graph 7).

### **Merchandise Trade Balance**

In the June 2018 quarter, the total value of imports (\$227.7 million) exceeded that of exports (\$25.9 million), resulting in a trade deficit of \$201.8 million). (See Table 1 and Graph 8).

## **Technical Notes**

The main source of imports and exports data comes from the administrative document, a completed customs form (Single Administrative data) required to be filled in by importers and exporters or customs agents when clearing merchandise inward and outward through the Ministry for Revenue (Custom Department)

## **Definitions**

June 2018 quarter: (April, May, June 2018)

Capital goods: are produced assets that are used repeatedly or continuously, for longer than one year, in industrial production processes. Examples are machinery, trucks, and aircraft.

cif: is the cost of goods, including insurance and freight to Samoa.

Consumption goods: are goods used (without further transformation in industrial production processes) by households, government, or non-profit institutions serving households.

Exports (domestic): are goods of domestic origin exported from Samoa to another country. Exports in this release are valued fob and are shown in Samoan tala.

fob: is free on board (the value of goods at Samoa ports before export).

Imports: are goods imported into Samoa. Imports in this release are valued at cif and are shown in Samoan tala.

Intermediate goods: are goods used up, or transformed in, industrial production processes.

Merchandise trade: covers exports or imports of goods that alter the nation's stock of material resources.

Provisional: statistics for the latest three months are provisional, to allow late data and amendments to be included.

Re-exports: are exports of foreign goods which were previously recorded as Samoa's imports.

Trade balance: is calculated by deducting imports (cif) from exports (fob). These two valuations are not entirely comparable, because the cif valuation includes insurance and freight to Samoa, while the fob valuation excludes insurance and freight from Samoa.

Trade deficit: occurs when the value of imports is more than the value of exports.

Trade surplus: occurs when the value of exports is more than the value of imports.
