LOCAL MARKET SURVEY **DECEMBER 2023**

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

Key findings:

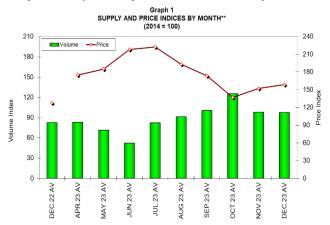
The Local Market Survey in December 2023 showed that the overall volume slightly declined 1 percent while average prices increased by 4 percent when compared to November 2023.

- The decrease in the supply of most of the agricultural produce to the local markets strongly contributed to the rise in the price index.
- The value of supplies increased 13 percent to \$103,700 from the previous month.
- The total number of sellers decreased 16 percent to 228 in December 2023 from the 272 recorded in November 2023.

OVERVIEW

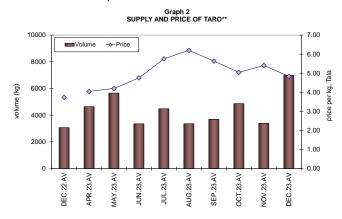
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the local markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in December 2023 showed a 1 percent decrease in the overall volume from November 2023. This was due to the significant reductions in the supply of most agricultural produce at the markets with the exception of taro, ta'amu, coconut, breadfruit and cucumber. When compared to December 2022, current supply increased by 17 percent. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Limited supply of agricultural produce prompted overall price level to rise 4 percent from the previous month. When compared with December 2022, the overall price level went up by 25 percent.

TARO

The supply of taro to the Local Markets in December 2023 increased to more than double (to 6,975 kilograms) from the previous month, leading to the decrease in prices by 11 percent (to \$4.83 per kilogram). When compared to December 2022, current supply of taro increased more than two times while its average price rose 29 percent. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)

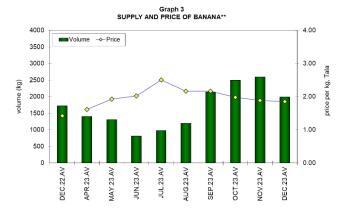


In the twelve months ending December 2023, supply of taro fell 4 percent, while its average price increased 29 percent when compared to the twelve months ending December 2022.

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BANANA

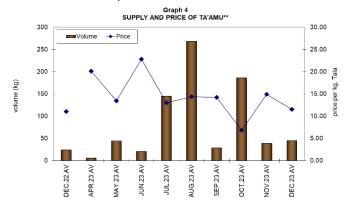
Banana supplies in the month under review decreased 23 percent (to 1,990 kilograms) from November 2023 while average price decreased by 2 percent (to \$1.85 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply and average price of banana both increased by 16 and 30 percent respectively. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1&2).



Annually, banana supplies increased by 5 percent compared to the year ended November 2022, while its average price increased 25 percent.

TA'AMU

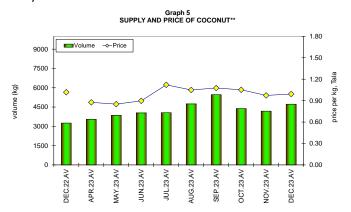
At an average of 45 kilograms, ta'amu supplied at the markets in December 2023 increased 16 percent compared to the previous month while its average price decreased by 23 percent (to \$11.56 per kilogram). In comparison to the same month last year, current supply of ta'amu rose 88 percent while its average price increased by 5 percent. (See Graph 4 and Tables 1&2)



In the year ending December 2023, volume of ta'amu supplied to the markets increased 27 percent while its price increased 82 percent over the year ending December 2022.

COCONUT

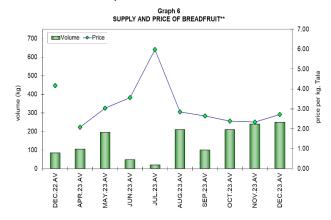
Coconut supplies at 4,724 kilograms increased by 13 percent from November 2023 and its average price increased by 2 percent (to \$0.99 per kilogram). In comparison to December 2022, current supply increased by 45 percent while average price decreased by 2 percent. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



In the twelve months ending December 2023, supply of coconut increased 11 percent while its average price rose 10 percent when compared to the twelve months ending December 2022.

BREADFRUIT

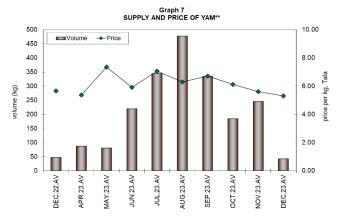
The supply of breadfruit in December 2023 increased 4 percent (to 250 kilograms) from the previous month, and its average price rose 17 percent (to \$2.72 per kilogram) due to the increase in supply. When compared to December 2022, current supply of breadfruit increased more than doubled while its average prices decreased 35 percent. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1&2)



Annually, supply of breadfruit increased 1 percent while average prices increased 53 percent over the year ended December 2022.

YAM

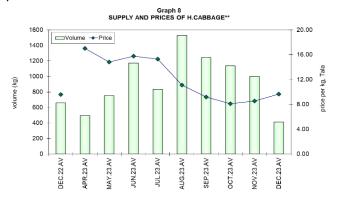
In the month under review, yam supplies decreased 83 percent (to 43 kilograms) from the previous month, while its average price fell 5 percent (to \$5.31 per kilogram). Current supply of yam decreased by 10 percent and its average price also decreased by 6 percent. (See Graph 7 and Tables 1 & 2)

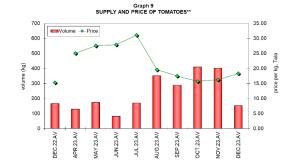


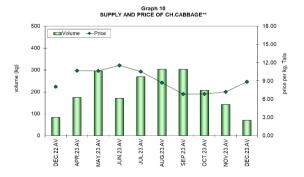
Supply of yam in the twelve months ending December 2023 increased 40 percent in comparison to the twelve months ending December 2022. Its average price rose 33 percent.

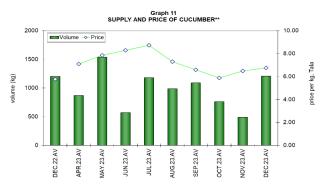
VEGETABLE PRODUCE

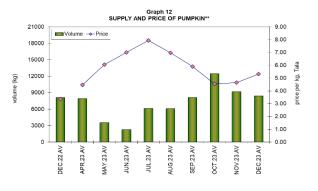
Vegetable produce supplied to the local markets in December 2023 all experienced decreases over the previous month except for cucumber which increased more than doubled (to 1207 kilograms) from the previous month. Tomatoes supplies fell 62 percent (to 153 kilograms), head cabbage supplies declined 59 percent (to 410 kilograms) followed by Chinese cabbage and pumpkin supplies which decreased by 50 percent (to 71 kilograms) and 9 percent (to 8,403 kilograms) respectively from the previous month. 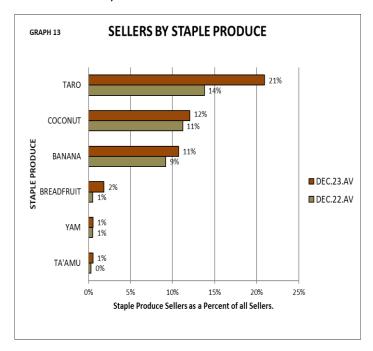


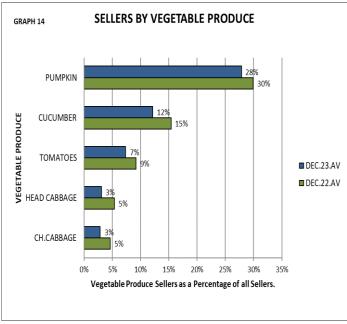


Subsequent to the decline in the supply of almost all of the vegetables available at the local markets in the month under review, their average prices increased. Cucumber prices increased by 4 percent (to \$6.76 per kilogram), Chinese cabbage increased by 23 percent (to \$8.89 per kilogram), Head cabbage and tomatoes both increased by 13 percent each (to \$9.65 per kilogram and to \$18.31 per kilogram) and Pumpkin also increased by 14 percent (to \$5.31 per kilogram) when compared to November 2023.

SELLERS

At 228, the average number of sellers at the local markets in December 2023 fell 16 percent from the previous month and down 3 percent when compared with the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 13 and 14 and Table 6).

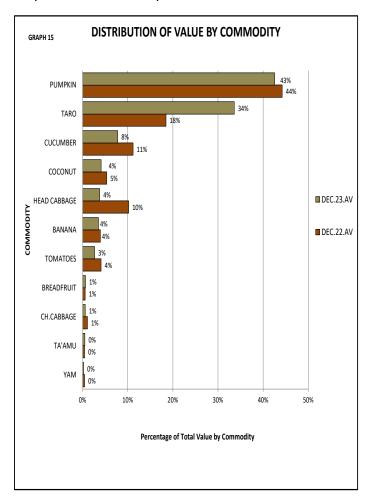




In December 2023, sellers of vegetables at 53 percent were the largest group at the local markets, decreasing from the 55 percent in the previous month and 64 percent in the same month last year. However, staple food sellers which made up 47 percent of total sellers increased from the 45 percent in November 2023 and 36 percent in December 2022.

VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the local markets was \$103,700 in December 2023. It increased 13 percent from the previous month and 67 percent when compared to December 2022.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce supplied to the markets with a share of 43 percent in December 2023; a level that was lower than the 47 percent in the previous month and the 44 percent in the same month a year ago. Supplies of taro contributed 33 percent to total value, increasing from the 20 percent last month and 18 percent in the same month a year ago.

Cucumber supplies followed with 8 percent of total value, up from the 3 percent in November 2023 but were lower than the 11 percent in December 2022. Coconut, head cabbage and banana all contributed 4 percent each of total value, while tomato, breadfruit, Chinese cabbage, ta'amu and yam recorded the lowest shares in the month under review. Technical Notes

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Lotopa, Ululoloa, Afega, Saleimoa, Savaia, Vaoala, Faatoia and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

** Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and Savaii and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
