Highlights of the month

June 2026 compared with May 2026

Merchandise Exports¹

- ❖ The total value of exports in June 2026 rose by 1.9% (or \$0.2 million) to \$8.9 million. This increase was driven by higher exports and re-exports in the following categories:
 - ❖ Animal or vegetable fats and oils (up \$0.4 million)
 - ❖ Mineral fuels, oils and products (up \$0.3 million)
 - ❖ Prepared foodstuffs, beverages, spirits and tobacco (up \$0.3 million)
 - ❖ Vegetable products (up \$0.1 million)
- ❖ Exports to the USA at \$0.7 million (an increase of \$0.6 million), Singapore at \$1.4 million (an increase of \$0.1 million) and Australia valued at \$0.6 million (an increase of \$0.2 million) recorded the largest increases in June 2026. These increases were mainly driven by higher exports of coconut oil and beer, as well as re-exports of petroleum products and other items.
- ❖ Consequently, exports to the Americas region totaled \$0.8 million, showing the largest increase of \$0.6 million in the reviewed period. This was largely attributed to increased exports of coconut oil to the USA.

Merchandise Imports

- ❖ In June 2026, the total value of imports increased by 22.1% (or \$24.6 million) to \$136.0 million. This increase reflected higher imports in the following categories:
 - ❖ Mineral products (up \$19.6 million)
 - ❖ Machinery, mechanical & electrical appliances and parts thereof (up \$5.0 million)
 - ❖ Vehicles, aircraft & associated transport equipment (up \$1.9 million)
 - ❖ Plastic, rubber & articles thereof (up \$1.1 million)
- ❖ Imports from Singapore totaled \$43.4 million (an increase of \$19.0 million), Fiji at \$16.1 million (an increase of \$5.6 million), and Australia at \$12.9million (an increase of \$2.9 million), which recorded the largest increases in the reviewed month. These were driven by higher imports of petroleum oils and gas products, rechargeable batteries, plastic bags and containers, and other items.
- ❖ Imports from the Asia region totaled \$71.1 million in June 2026, recording the largest increase of \$25.8 million, mainly due to the increase in imports of petroleum products in the reviewed month.

Trade Balance

- ❖ The total value of imports (\$136.0 million) was greater than the value of exports (\$8.9 million), resulting in a trade deficit of \$127.1 million. The trade deficit increased by 23.8% compared to the previous month but also increased by 16.6% when compared to the same month last year.

 - ❖ Suāu'u (si'itia i le \$0.3 miliona)
 - ❖ Oloa gaosi, vai inu, ava malosi ma isi (si'itia i le \$0.3 miliona)
 - ❖ Fua/l'o o laau 'aina (si'itia i le \$0.1 miliona)
- ❖ O oloa tuuina atu i USA e \$0.7 miliona le tau aofai (si'itia i le \$0.6 miliona), Sigapoa e \$1.4 miliona le tau aofai (si'itia i le \$0.1 miliona) ma Ausetalia e \$0.6 miliona (si'itia i le \$0.2 miliona), na faamauina le si'itia i le masina o Iuni 2026. - ❖ O le itulagi o Amerika na faamauina e tele oloa na auina atu ai ma e \$0.8 miliona lona tau aofai, sa faamauina le si'itia mauualuga i le \$0.6 miliona pe'a faatusa i le masina ua mavae. O le tele o nei oloa o le suāu'u popo.

 - ❖ Masini inisinia, masini tau eletise ma isi mea faigaluega (si'itia i le \$5.0 miliona)
 - ❖ Taavale, va'alele ma ona vaega eseese (si'itia i le \$1.9 miliona)
 - ❖ Oloa gaosia i le ūga, pa'u ma isi (si'itia i le \$1.1 miliona)
- ❖ O oloa auina mai i Sigapoa e \$43.4 miliona (si'itia i le \$19.0 miliona), Fiti e \$16.1 miliona (si'itia le \$5.6 miliona) ma Ausetalia e \$12.9 miliona (si'itia i le \$2.9 miliona) na faamauina le tele o oloa na auina mai ai e pei o le suāu'u, ma'a mo taavale ma masini, ato ūga ma isi lava oloa.
- ❖ O oloa na auina mai i le itulagi o Asia e \$71.1 miliona lona tau aofai ia Iuni 2026, faamauina le si'itia mauualuga i le \$25.8 miliona faatusa i le masina ua mavae. O lenei si'itaga na afua mai i le telē o le suāu'u na auina mai i le masina lava lea.

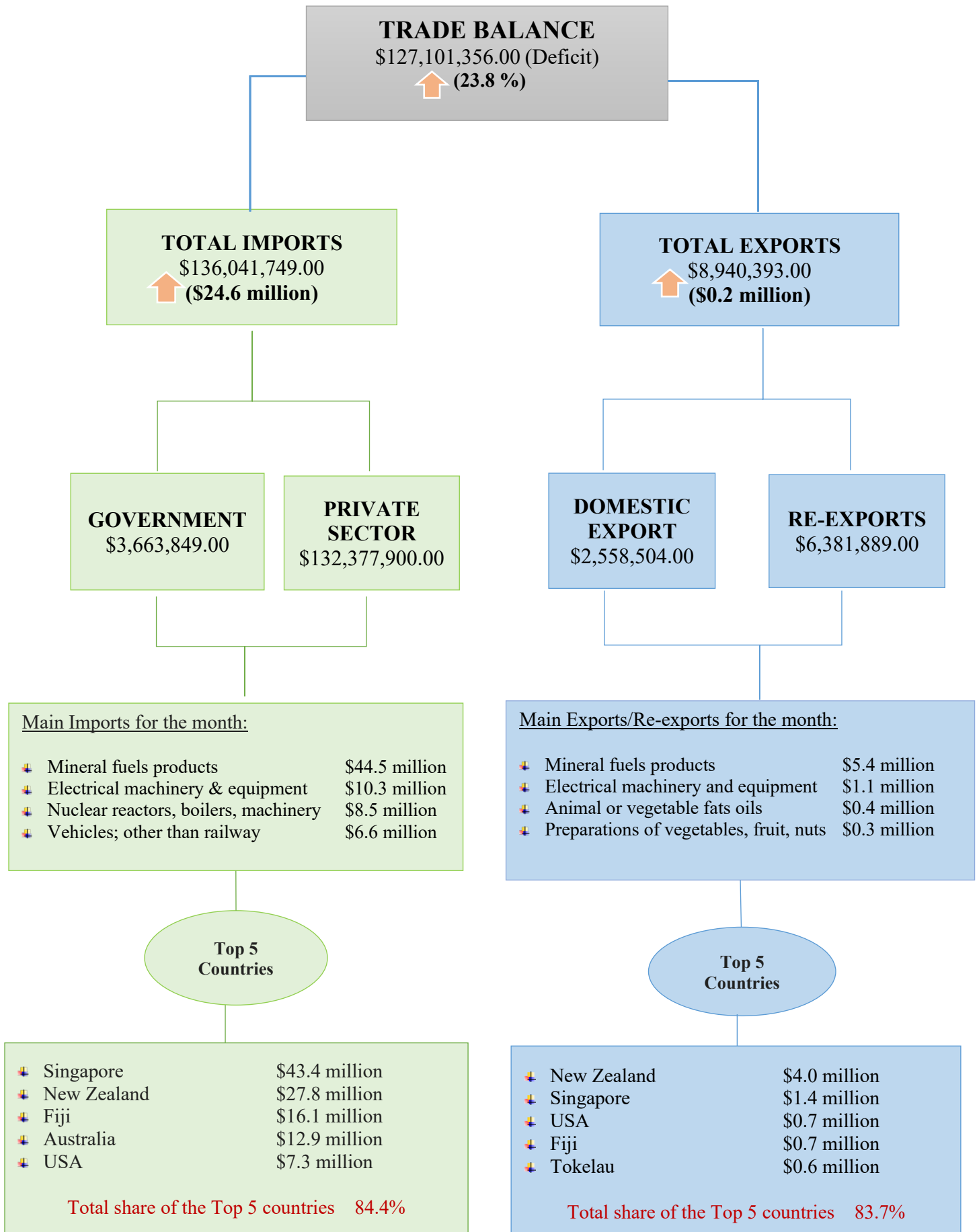

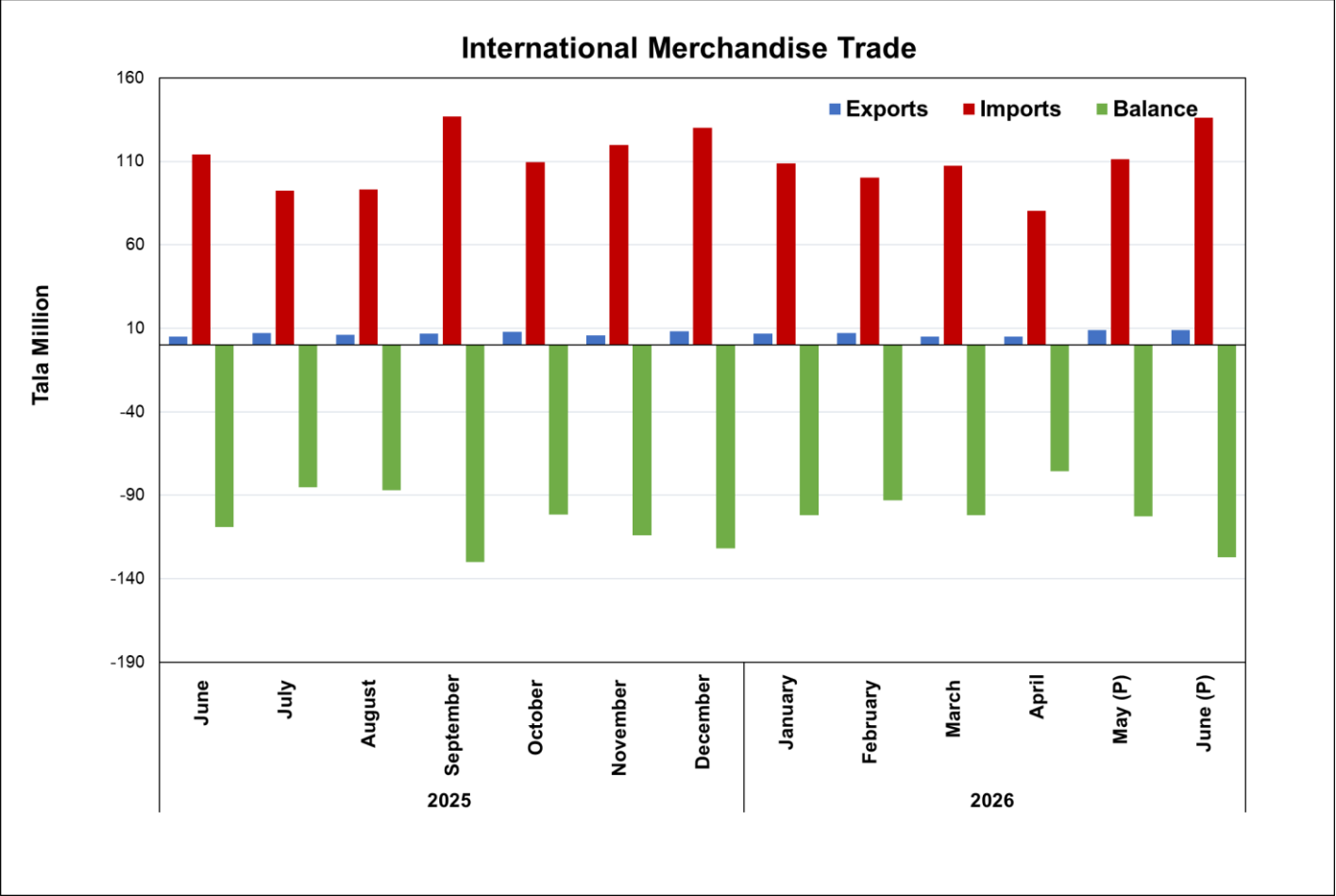

Technical Notes

The primary source of import and export data is the administrative customs document, the Single Administrative data (SAD). The form is required to be filled out by importers, exporters, or customs agents when clearing merchandise entering and leaving Samoa through the Ministry of Customs.

Definitions

Merchandise Exports

Includes both Exports and re-exports.

- **Exports** refer to goods that are produced, manufactured, or significantly transformed within Samoa and then shipped to other countries.
- **Re-exports** refer to goods that are previously imported into Samoa and are subsequently exported without undergoing substantial transformation. These goods may be stored, repackaged, or redistributed before being sent to another country.

Introduction of New Tables

Starting January 2026, new tables have been added to provide more detailed information and enhanced data accessibility. These tables have been added in response to user requests and complement the existing tables. These new tables include:

- Tables 2 & 6: Exports and Imports by broad groups/HS sections.
- Table 4 & 8: Major exports and by agricultural products and main imports and by NCD-related items.
- Tables 10 & 11: Combined presentation of exports and imports by country and by region, reflecting trade balances.

The July 2026 Merchandise Trade report is expected to be available on **August 13, 2026**.

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
